Highlight of the Quarter

Northwest Region staff participated in the Florida Anthropological Society annual meeting through papers, posters, and participation in the FPAN Board meeting. NW Region staff copresented the Spring HADS, held in Marathon for a full class of diving leadership, and a SSEAS class, held in Clearwater for a motivated group from the Clearwater Aquarium. Large outreach events are a staple of the NW Region in spring, including Legends and Lore at Falling Water State Park that brings school children from four counties and the general public, and UWF's Festival on the Green.
